Concept Attainment

Concept attainment allows students to see patterns and infer an overarching concept that is related to a group of words or ideas. By analyzing groups of words, students are able to gain an understanding of the characteristics of a concept and form a definition.



When using concept attainment, go through the following steps:

1. Create two list headings in a t-Chart:

YES	NO

- 2. Create lists of ideas, concepts or objects that students might be familiar with. One by one, categorize these under the 'Yes' or 'No' heading.
- 3. Part way through categorizing, have students hypothesize what the concept is. Have them jot down their idea.
- 4. Place more ideas into the 'Yes' or 'No' heading. Have students check their hypothesis.
- 5. Have students suggest more ideas under the 'Yes' column.
- 6. When most students have written down a hypothesis, reveal the concept. Students reflect on their thinking.
